

OUT History



Plymouth is now a thriving community, but when the first settlers came upon Plymouth, they would have seen not much more than wilderness and a stream surrounded by swampy land covered with thickets of alder. Plymouth was originally known by early Native Americans as Ta-quit-qui-oc or Crooked River. Plymouth was originally surveyed in 1835 by United States Engineers with the first land purchase made in 1836.

Plymouth has a rich history beginning when the first settlers, Isaac Thorpe along with his two sons John and Rensallaer and his son-in-law, William Bowen, arrived May 8th, 1845. The men, natives of Pennsylvania, traveled all day from neighboring Sheboygan Falls. By May 12th they had built a log home. There was no floor or chimney, but it kept them safe. As the men were preparing for their first night in the new home, three wagons arrived carrying men, women and children. That first night, all shared the new log home. Four days after that night, on May 16th, Mrs. Thorpe and their daughter arrived.

In July 1845, Henry Davidson and his son Thomas arrived. Henry gave the name of Springfield to the new settlement, but Thomas renamed it Plymouth, after Plymouth, Connecticut, where his sweetheart died and lay buried.

Many more families arrived and settled in the following years, and in 1847, a surveyor was employed to lay out the western side Plymouth. That spring, a log grocery store was built. Following were a small log shop, blacksmith and shoemaker. A business district was in the works. One would spend twelve cents for a pound of coffee, eleven cents for a pound of butter, shoes for a dollar and corn meal for \$175 per hundred pounds. The neighboring Natives were frequent customers at the store, selling their goods and purchasing other articles they desired.

The first sawmill was built in 1848, and a grist mill was erected in fall 1849. Just over a decade after the first residents settled in Plymouth, there was a need for a rail center. The arrival of the Sheboygan and Mississippi Railroad came in April 1859, and the Milwaukee and Northern Railroad followed in 1871.









With the growing city, there was a need for a fire department. Organized in October 1868, a hand engine and 200 feet of rubber hose were purchased. By 1875, a fire house had been built and the department consisted of three divisions; chemical crew, hook and ladder crew and a gang of firefighters.

Plymouth was incorporated as a city in 1877, and Otto Puhlman was elected Mayor. Plymouth was nicknamed "The Hub City", not just because of the central location in the county, but for the manufacturing of hubs and spokes for wagons and bicycles.

As Plymouth grew, it had many different types of industry; cigar, furniture, phonograph and beer among them, but it gained its reputation as the "Cheese Capital of the World". Cheeseville was the common name for the section of town south of the depot where cheese was manufactured, collected, stored, cured, graded, packed and shipped all over the world. In fact, during World War II, more than 1,000 of Plymouth's 4,400 citizens found employment in the cheese industry. From 1918 to 1955 the Wisconsin Cheese Exchange, which operated out of the Exchange Bank building downtown, helped to establish, influence and set national cheese prices.





Isaac Thorpe would be proud to see what Plymouth has become. Built by determination, ingenuity and hard work, the values of Plymouth residents remain the same today. Most of the wilderness has been shaped into parks, schools, residential areas and a booming downtown district.

There are many beautiful, historic buildings and homes throughout Plymouth. There are 18 buildings that have been landmarked by the city, and a brochure has been made for a self-guided tour of these landmarked buildings. You may pick up a brochure at the Plymouth Chamber of Commerce Office or the Plymouth Historical Society Museum.

The Plymouth Historical Society museum, located in downtown Plymouth, is housed in a three story cream city brick commercial building built in 1875. It was originally built as a tavern and residence for Mr. William Sebald and his family. It has been home to the Historical Society since 2007. Open year round, the free family friendly museum offers changing exhibits that have included a general store, a vintage parlor, cheese making, Indian arrowheads and artifacts, and much more!

















10 Must Sees

Murals, Murals & Murals

Plymouth boasts 30 murals painted throughout the downtown! 21 of these murals were painted by the "Walldogs" in the summer of 2011. 5 were added in 2021. Each mural captures the nostalgia and historic significance of Plymouth's rich business history. 2 Antoinette the Cow

No visit to Plymouth is complete without snapping a selfie in front of our favorite roadside attraction, Antoinette! Antoinette stands 20 feet tall, was made out of fiberglass, and erected in 1977 as part of the Plymouth's Centennial celebration. She honors the area's legacy of dairy production.






A DIFFERENT BREED OF MURALIST

11 S. Milwaukee Street

2-acre park located near the intersection of S. Milwaukee Street (Hwy 67) and E. Mill Street. It contains two lighted tennis courts and a foot bridge that crosses the Mullet River. There is also a recreation trail that begins/ends at S. Milwaukee Street and follows the Mullet River to the east.

Bishop Avenue Park 🚓

Located at the end of Bishop Street, this .2-acre park contains playground equipment and a picnic area.



Carl Loebe Field 🛇 👫

630 Loebe Drive

Carl Loebe Field functions as an active recreation facility. This 4.5-acre site includes a lighted baseball diamond, fencing, concession stand, bleachers, and rest rooms.



City Park is the community's most versatile park. This 18-acre facility is the city's largest developed park and provides a variety of active and passive recreational pursuits. City Park is home to the Aquatic Center and the 7th Element Skate Park. Other facilities include a lighted softball diamond, concession stand, rest rooms, basketball court, volleyball court, outdoor aquatic center with zero-entry pool and slides, playground equipment, picnic areas, lighted winter sledding hill, large parking lot and band shell. The Lower Shelter is available for rent as are the Cake Stand and Band Shell.



Evergreen Golf Course 👢

Plymouth's Municipal Golf Course. Family fun for everyone! 38 acres, 9-hole, short course and driving range, open to the public, open tee times, club rental, pull carts. Open daily mid-April through October.

Evergreen-Kensington Park 🚓

Adjacent to Evergreen Golf Course, .5-acre park that contains playground equipment.



Henry H. Huson Park 🏌 🦶

400 Collins Street

This 2.4-acre park has bench seating adjacent to the Recreation Trail which runs from the northeast to the southwest following the Mullet River. A foot bridge crosses over to the downtown area. Within the park area is a steeply wooded hillside located along the river.

25-acre park located in the southwest portion of the city adjacent to the Mullet River. This park has playground equipment, a parking lot, and a Frisbee golf course. Meyer Park contains a paved walking path for enjoyment of the natural beauty of the area. The recreation trail runs through the park beginning at Daleview Drive and continues to S. Milwaukee Street.

This 6.7-acre site contains a lighted youth baseball diamond, covered bleachers, a concession stand, bathrooms, a soccer field, and a parking lot.

This park was completed late 2017. This ADA-inclusive playground features a dairy farm theme and is designed for kids up to 12 years of age. Also in the park is an open-air park shelter/performance pavilion. Located next to the park is a fenced in dog park.

This facility is near Riverview Middle School on the Mullet River. Besides the outdoor basketball court, the youth center provides ample indoor space for various clubs, organizations, and private citizens to hold meetings, parties, and other related activities.



Roosevelt-Nutt Park & Nutt Ski Hill 🏌 🦶

Roosevelt-Nutt Park is a 10-acre site presently has nature trails winding through the woods with educational stops. Nutt Ski Hill is a 7-acre facility that has a beginners and main ski hill, two electric rope tows, snow making equipment and a parking lot. There is a log cabin style shelter with a kitchen, restrooms, and enclosed deck and a beautiful view from the top of the hill overlooking the northwest part of the city. This shelter is available for rentals and educational opportunities.



The trail winds along the Mullet River starting at Eastern Avenue and ends near the Mullet River Dam. There are 12 landmarks with flags representative of the war or conflict each landmark symbolizes. There are seating areas and an entry plaza with a Memorial Bell.







The Mayor of the City of Plymouth is Don Pohlman, who serves part-time. Mayor Pohlman works with the City Administrator to ensure that all city ordinances and state laws are observed and enforced, and that all city officers, staff, boards, and commissions properly discharge their duties. The Mayor is present at all Common Council meetings and may vote in the case of a tie. The Mayor represents Plymouth at official gatherings.

The Common Council is the legislative branch of City Government. The Common Council is the forum for review and debate of proposed ordinances, resolutions and policies proposed by the standing Council Committees and boards and commissions. The most important legislation is the annual City Budget. The Common Council is comprised of eight part-time alderpersons representing four aldermanic districts. Each alderperson serves a two-year term. The Council operates on a committee structure, with the following standing committees:

- · Committee of the Whole (Entire Common Council)
- Finance & Personnel Committee (4 Council members and Mayor)
- Public Works & Utilities Committee (4 Council members and Mayor)

In addition to the Council committees, there are several boards and commissions that provide policy input to the Mayor and Common Council and are comprised of citizen members and alderperson representation. These bodies include the Plan Commission, Board of Park Commissioners, Redevelopment Authority, and Library Board as prescribed by Wisconsin statutes. From time to time, the City may also have "ad-hoc" committees like the "Utilities Building Committee."

Common Council Meetings are held on the second and last Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the City Hall.

The City Administrator serves as the Chief Administrative Officer of the Municipal Corporation, leading, planning, organizing, and directing the administration of the City of Plymouth toward fulfillment of goals and policies determined by the Mayor and Common Council. The City Administrator-Utilities Manager assists the Mayor and Common Council by facilitating the establishment of goals and proposing alternative strategies for their accomplishment. The City Administrator-Utilities Manager directs the use of human and fiscal resources toward the accomplishment of City goals.

Led by Fire Chief Ryan Pafford, the Plymouth Fire Department is comprised of the City and Town Fire Departments. The Fire Department covers an area of approximately 36 square miles and a population of over 13,000. The Department utilizes two fire stations, one in the city and one in the town.

Services Provided Include: provide hazardous condition and disaster mitigation; fire suppression; automobile extrication; ice rescue; fire education and prevention services; Emergency Medical Service (EMS).

Orange Cross Ambulance, Inc. is a joint venture between HSHS St. Nicholas Hospital and Aurora Sheboygan Memorial Medical Center. Health Care and serves the City of Sheboygan and surrounding communities. The medically trained dispatchers are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, to assist with transportation needs. All dispatchers at Orange Cross Ambulance are medically trained, and many are trained paramedics with previous transport experience. They operate five Advance Life Support ambulances providing pre-hospital Paramedic level care. The Orange Cross Ambulance services the northwestern section of Sheboygan County, covering an area of 380 square miles.

Among the many services provided by the Department of Public Works are:

Sports and Activities

Plymouth is truly an all year community for a wide variety of activities. We are fortunate to have many different community organizations that provide options for keeping everyone active and engaged. During the beautiful Wisconsin spring, summer and fall seasons there are so many opportunities to participate or simply spectate. Our wonderful Wisconsin winters may seem cold and long but embracing the winter activities makes it pass too quickly.

The Plymouth Community Education provides classes ranging from cooking to crafts to woodworking and personal fitness. There are a variety of community sports programs offered by individual organizations available to school age children.







Spring, Summer & Fall

Boating, Canoeing and Kayaking

Public access throughout the surrounding Plymouth area is provided on many lakes by either a developed boat landing or walk-in access. There is a new ADA Compliant Kayak and Canoe Launch along the Mullet River, located next to the Plymouth Youth Center, 609 North Street, Plymouth.

Frisbee Golf

The city maintains an 18-hole Frisbee-golf course at Meyer Park. The course features woods, a river and a variety of long shots. There is also a course located at Road America.

Golf

Evergreen Golf Course offers family fun for everyone with their 9-hole short course and driving range. Open to the public, open tee times, club rental, pull carts and golf carts. Open daily April through October.

Hiking

There are several miles of hiking trails within the Kettle Moraine Forest-Northern Unit. The Ice Age National Scenic Trail travels for 31 miles through the length of the forest. Hiking is also available at the Greenbush recreation area (13.5 miles) and Parnell Tower loop (3.5 miles)

Horseback Riding

Equestrians can enjoy 41 miles of bridle trail through the Northern Kettle Moraine Forest which are traditionally open late-April through mid-November depending on the trail conditions.

Mini Golf & Batting Cages

Play 18 or 36 holes on the family friendly yet challenging Shady Trails or Stoney Creek courses at Tom & Jerry's mini golf and batting cages. Work on your baseball, softball or fast pitch swing in one of six cages. Bring your own equipment or borrow theirs.

Skate Park

7th Element Skate Park is a small outdoor skate park, included two 4 foot quarter pipes, two 4 foot mini roll-ins, one 3 foot spine and more.

Tennis

The city maintains two tennis courts at Bade-Utility Park. The courts are open on a first-come, first-served basis and are lit at night.

Vita Course

Located on the grounds of Generations Intergenerational Center, the Generations Vita Course offers fitness fanatics of all ages and abilities the opportunity to have more exercise choices at Plymouth's only Vita Course. Offering 10 exercise stations.

Road America 4 Miles of Fitness

Monday and Wednesday nights from 5:30-7:30pm May-September. Participants have free reign over Road America's cross country trails, service roads, and the 4-mile, 14 turn road racing surface itself. Bike, walk or run.

Bikind

The Old Plank Road Trail


The trail runs from the Kohler Erie Avenue Trailhead in the City of Sheboygan west roughly 17 miles to the hamlet of Greenbush. The terrain varies from flat to gently rolling with one large climb or descent near County Highway S just east of Greenbush. One Trailhead is located on Plymouth's east side. The trail is shared by a variety of users including cyclists, walkers, joggers, mopeders, equestrians as well as snowmobilers in the winter months.

Kettle Moraine Forest, Northern Unit

A single-track mountain bike trail is maintained at the Greenbush recreation area, totaling about 9 miles. A state trail pass is required for all bike riders age 16 and over on these trails. Normally these trails are opened in late April through November, depending on trail conditions.

Plymouth Recreational Trail

A dedicated trail winding throughout the city, follows along city streets and city-paved routes. Connects to The Old Plank Road Trail

Cross Country Skiing

Kettle Moraine State Forest, Northern Unit
The Greenbush recreation area offers more than 13 miles
of machine-groomed cross-country ski trails. Pets and
hiking are not allowed on ski trails. A state trail pass is
required at Greenbush and Zillmer for all skiers age 16 and
over. Volunteers from the Northern Kettle Moraine Nordic
Ski Club (NKMNSC), in cooperation with the state forest,
regularly machine groom the ski trail system for diagonal
and skate skiing.

Ice Skating

Located at the far eastern end of Main St., Plymouth's Mill Pond is a beautiful setting to spend some time ice skating. Our warming house offers free skate rentals, warm drinks, snacks and restroom facilities. The rink is open when there are seven inches of measured ice.

Plymouth City Park

"Cardboard Hill" is a lighted winter sledding hill on the east side of the park, with a large parking lot.

Snowshoeing

Kettle Moraine State Forest, Northern Unit Hikers and snowshoers may explore several miles of trails that are not groomed for skiing. Some trails in the forest that are open for snowshoeing include Greenbush and New Fane snowshoe trails, Moraine Nature Trail, Tamarack Nature Trail, Parnell Trail, Butler Lake Trail and the Ice Age National Scenic Trail.





The Mullet River is a river that travels through Plymouth, Wisconsin. It is surrounded by natural beauty and also cuts through downtown. This little gem offers scenic beauty and opportunities for kayaking and fishing.

Kayaking on the Mullet River is now made easier by a new kayak launch located by Riverview Middle School. Take your kayaks or canoes there for an easy, hassle free drop into the river. This is also the widest/largest portion of the river so you are able to explore without worrying about the Mullet's varying water levels.

Fishing is another great way to enjoy the Mullet River. The most popular species caught are Smallmouth bass, Northern pike, and Bluegill. A popular location for fishing is at the dam located by Veterans Memorial Trail, downtown Plymouth.

Take a look at some of the fish you may discover in the Mullet River. >>>

Bluegill

Labeled a "panfish," the bluegill is almost as wide as it is long. Length sometimes reaches 10-12 inches, and weights go up to 2 pounds.

Smallmouth Bass

An average smallmouth weighs between 1 and 2 pounds, will measure about 12 inches and is considered the scrappiest fish of all.




The largemouth grows to a weight of 11 pounds and length of about 24 inches.



Pike attain lengths of as much as 50 inches. The record Wisconsin fish weighed 38 pounds.



Native to Europe, brown trout in Wisconsin have a common catch size of 16" and 2 pounds.


